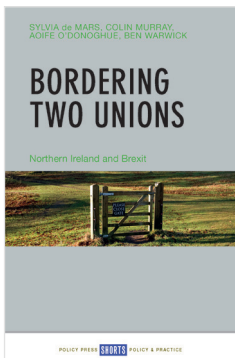


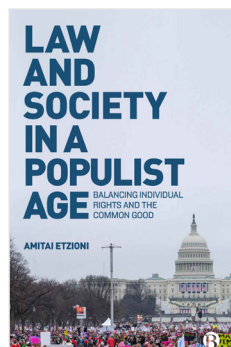

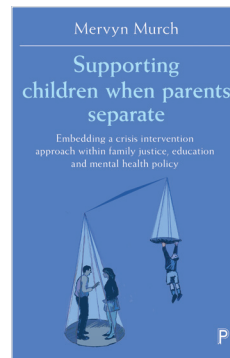
Draws upon EU, UK, Irish and international law, showing what the future might hold for a post-Brexit Northern Ireland.

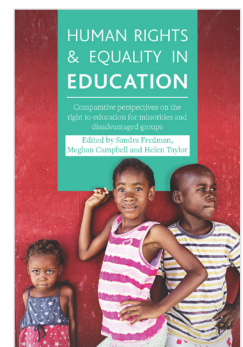

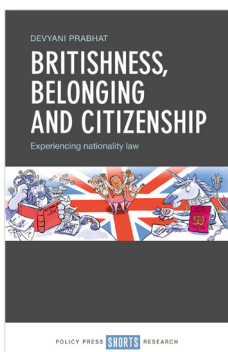
Offers a fresh approach to how the family justice system should support children following parental separation and divorce.

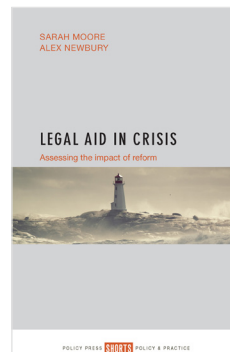

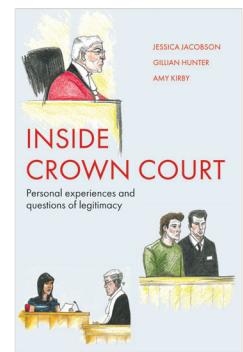
