Bristol University Press is delighted to announce a new book series that will explore issues on and around organizations and activism. This is a topic of growing interest to scholars in organization studies, sociology, politics, geography and beyond.

The series will consider organizations in the broader sense, and the editors positively welcome proposals from scholars working in a broad range of fields such as development studies, cultural studies and gender studies.

Books in this series will offer (a) critical examinations of organizations as sites of/targets for activism, and (b) consider academics as activists and agents of change. Books may focus on specific organizations and industries, but the series welcomes broader topic-based studies too.

The series will publish authored and edited works of between 60,000 – 80,000 words in length, and which will be of interest to academics and students across a wide range of disciplines and subject areas. The publishing process begins with the submission of a formal proposal that can be made at any stage in the writing process: before starting the book, with a partial draft, or with a full draft manuscript in hand. After an initial assessment by an international editorial board, each proposal will be peer reviewed by a minimum of two academic referees. If the book is commissioned for inclusion in the series, the final manuscript will again be peer reviewed before it is accepted for publication.
